Goals of the program include:


- Supporting the "whole student"

2. Surveys distributed online & in person at summer orientations



Program Outcomes and Lessons Learned

Attendance

- ☐ More than 100 students attended six workshops:
- ☐ Health literacy 33 participants
- ☐ Financial literacy 35 participants
- ☐ Civic literacy 41 participants



Survey Results

☐ Students filled out a short survey at the end of each workshop. ☐ 100% of students said "yes" or "maybe" when asked if they would consider attending a future Adulting 101 workshop.

Qualitative Feedback

Student responses emphasized information literacy skills and concepts and feeling more welcome in the library.
