Guided Notes: is an outline note structure given to students. They include blank spaces, graphic organizers and other visual aids. Students are prompted to fill in the notes during a presentation.

Guided Notes Improve Information Retention	Guide Notes Increase Student Engagement

Common Types of Guided Notes Organizers:

Common Types of Articles in Library Databases Academic articles will either be classified as Primary or Secondary Articles. Primary Articles: consist of findings from an original research project. The authors design a study, collect data, and present their findings and conclusions. Secondary Articles: Primary and other secondary articles to write ideas and concepts. They do not conduct any original research. SECONDARY ARTICLES - Used for Background Research Review Article: This type of research article uses secondary sources to explain a concept, discuss an important idea, and/or make a conclusion. Meta-Analysis: This type of research article uses secondary sources to take what we know about a topic and propose applying it to a new situation. Systematic Review: This type of research article summarizes previously published work in the field to identify what we know about the topic and to identify gaps in the research. Scoping Review: This type of research article summarizes previously published work in the field to identify what we know about the topic and to identify gaps in the research. Cooperative/Active Learning: Students work together in small groups toward exploring a concept or learning a skill. Each member of the groups is accountable both individually and to each other. Students directly engage with the content through discussion, problem-solving, analysis, or application.
