

Fast and Targeted

Microlearning is...

- "Bite-sized" content
- Single Learning Outcome
- More engaging for learners
- Evidence of better learning outcomes
- Reduces cognitive load for more effective information processing*



Microlearning is also...*

Complete

Includes elements such as content, practice, feedback and more.

Easy to Access

Platforms familiar to students and easily navigable are key.



Brief

10 minutes proposed as ideal completion time.

Fast-acting

Intended to be applied immediately.

Non-sequential

Can consist of multiple related narrow topics in a series, but each topic can stand alone.



 - Jumping out of the LMS to Google Sites




Research Skills 101 & 102 Redux

Two developments in Spring/Summer 2023 fueled the continuing evolution of Research Skills 101 and 102.

- Access to Articulate/Rise 360
- Integration into Blackboard

Is this approach as effective as we think it should be? Are students understanding the concepts and developing the skills we're hoping they develop to adequately fulfill the scaffolded approach to information literacy we're aiming for?

Aspirations

Micro-courses aren't just for First-Year Seminar courses. Part of our exploration of the format has included a micro-course revamp of our annual instruction retreat, plus plans to create stand-alone content for faculty and micro-concepts like SWIFT.
